

**CATFISH BEND CASINO**

**BLACKJACK TOURNAMENT**

**DATE & TIME:** Every Monday at 4:00 PM.

**ENTRY:** \$25 Limited to the first 48 players.

**PRIZE POOL:**

1. Players may sign up at Player Services by paying \$25. (\$21 buy-in that goes to the prize pool, \$3 administration fee and a \$1 dealer appreciation fee). Buy-ins and re-buys will be accepted up to the beginning of session two of the first round.
2. A player who is eliminated in the first session of round one may re-buy into the tournament based on availability.
3. Each player will receive \$1,000 in tournament chips for their buy-in. Chips will carry over to the next round for those players who advance.
4. Each session will consist of twenty (20) hands.
5. All Blackjacks will pay two-to-one.
6. Round one will consist of a maximum of two sessions. Each session will have a maximum of four tables with a maximum of six players at each table. The top 50% of players from each table will advance to the next round of play.
7. Round two will consist of one session with a maximum of four tables, each table having a maximum of six players. The top 50% of players from each table will advance to round three. If round two only has one table it will be the final round of the tournament.
8. Round three will consist of one session with a maximum of two tables, each having a maximum of six players. If round three only has one table it will be the final round of the tournament.
9. The top 50% of players from each table will advance to the final round of play.
10. Any fraction of a player will round up to the next whole number.
11. The Final Round will consist of one session with a maximum of one table with six players.
12. Seating assignments for each round will be decided through random drawings of cards designating table and seat number. The Tournament Official will shuffle the

cards face down on the table. Players will randomly pick one card designating their seat assignment.

13. Every effort will be made to seat six players at each of the six tables in Round One. If the number of players is less than a multiple of six, the Tournament Official will attempt to place an equal number of players at each table.
14. All tournament chips must stay on the table and cannot be concealed.
15. Any decision on how to bet, or how to play, must be solely that of the player. No communication, verbal or visual, will be permitted between spectators or players.
16. The dealing sequence will begin by placing the puck at gaming position number six, located immediately to the right of the dealer and the dealing will begin at first base and will continue by moving the puck sequentially from gaming position number six, to gaming position number one (left to right), and then repeated until all hands are dealt. Betting will follow this same sequence.
17. If the dealing sequence is dealt out of position, the Tournament Official will be called and the hand backed up to the spots as if the dealing sequence had been correctly dealt. The cards will not be backed up for any other reason.
18. Players must bet a minimum of \$5 of tournament chips on each hand dealt. There will be no maximum bet limit. If the player's remaining chips fall below the table minimum, all of the player's remaining chips must be bet on the next hand. If a player does not bet, that player will be immediately disqualified.
19. After a bet has been placed, it cannot be changed.
20. There will be twenty (20) clear plastic chips placed atop each table to keep track of the number of hands dealt. After each hand is completed, one of the clear chips will be removed from the top of the table and placed into the bank tray.
21. The only time chips may be counted during a round will be in the Final Round. This will be performed before the third to the last hand is dealt. Each player's tournament chips will be counted for all other players to see.
22. Once a player leaves their assigned table during the course of play, they have voluntarily withdrawn from the tournament.
23. If it becomes necessary to break a tie during tournament play, up to five additional hands will be dealt until the tie is broken.
24. Violation of Tournament Rules shall eliminate the player from further participation.
25. Unless otherwise stated, Catfish Bend Casinos II, LLC standard rules of Blackjack will apply.
26. The Tournament Official's decision is final.
